It's hard to believe that we will be marking the start of the High Holy Days on September 28th when we gather as a congregational family to celebrate erev *Rosh Hashanah*. Once again we will be distributing tickets by mail. However, we are also offering an opportunity for in-person ticket pickup on Sunday, September 18th from 10 - 11 AM

Only members in good standing who have paid dues and building fund commitments through September, 2011, religious school fees in full and remaining 2010/2011 obligations, will be issued tickets.

Please mail your dues and/or tuition payments to Temple Beth Am, P.O. Box 5305, Parsippany, 07054, before September 12th. If you are unable to pay your full balance you should contact Alan Tarr at 973.227.4778 prior to August 31st.

For security reasons all tickets will be imprinted with the name of the member and the name of the guest (where appropriate).

Children under the 3rd grade are not permitted in the Sanctuary during late services (infants included). However, in an effort to accommodate families who wish to worship together with their young children, we will welcome everyone at the 9:00AM (early service) on *Rosh Hashanah* and *Yom Kippur*. Children will be required to sit with their parents. For those congregants whose custom it is to attend the early service, please note these will not be "family services" nor will the liturgy be modified.

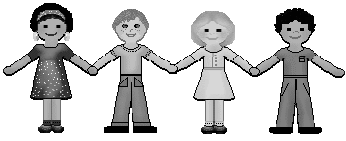
